# P.E.

PE lessons will continue to be on a Monday and we are asking that children continue to come dressed in their PE kit. During this time we will be learning about different reading strategies and answering comprehension questions. Below are some ideas for activities your child could complete at home. If your child does do any of the activities or any other work or activity linked to our topic please share it with us.

Write an Acrostic Poem about WinterChoose a word such as WINTER, SNOW,ICE, COLD, PENGUIN, ANTARTIC or anyother "wintry" words and create a poem.SNOW	<u>Go for a Winter Walk</u> Wrap up warm and go for a winter walk. What signs of winter can you spot?
