Write out a healthy recipe to encourage other children to eat more fruit and vegetables. You could also make the recipe and bring it in for the rest of our class to share.

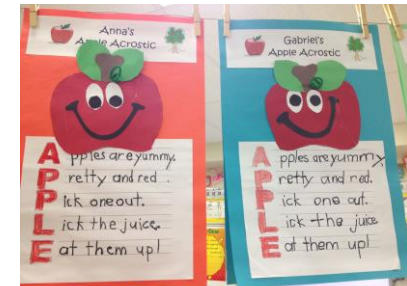
Draw a picture or make a model of an insect or mini beast that is either a pest, or helpful to gardeners. Label the different parts of your drawing or model.
