#### English

This term the children will be reading 'The Secret Garden' by Frances Hodgson Burnett. We will be analysing how the author makes the reader feel and how she does this. We will be looking closely at the setting in which the story is set and how that is described. We will use these descriptive techniques to write our own story based on the book. The children will then write explanation texts on how to grow different fruits and vegetables.

# **Humanities**

As part of their 'Allotment' topic, the children will learn about different types of plants, flowers and vegetables. They will design and build their own model secret gardens. They will make their own planters and tubs to grow food as well as plan their own vegetable patch. They will learn how to make dishes of seasonal foods and then harvest and sell the crops they have grown.

## Uniform, PE and kit

Elm class will continue to have PE on Wednesdays and Fridays with Mr Paynter. Please ensure your child always has their named PE kit in school. Children will get changed at school for PE each session. This term we will be focussing on differing team games in PE sessions and all PE lessons will once again take place outside on the MUGA or school field.

We hope to see some lovely summer weather this term, so it is essential that children have a hat and water bottle with them every day. It would also be useful for the children to apply sun cream in the morning before coming into school. The cloakroom area is small, so please keep to a minimum extra items being bought in. Children should not bring in toys or trading cards from home.

## <u>Maths</u>

This term we will continue with or work on decimal numbers and capacity. After this we will be focussing on money. We will be converting money from pounds and pence, adding and subtracting money and then finally working out change. It would support the children tremendously if you could give your child the opportunity to do this in a shop.
