Upcoming Community Projects

This year we will be taking part in two community art projects.

Forest Project

The Forest project is inspired by a piece from sculptor Antony Gormley called "Field for the British Isles" in 1993. The aim was to include was many people as possible in the creation of an artwork. Each person created a clay figure which was then displayed together like a modern day "terracotta army".

We will be taking part in a collaborative exhibition of paper trees to raise an awareness of the environment and sustainability. The forest of trees will be displayed at Peachcroft Farm in Abingdon in Spring.



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MUGA

As you will have seen on Class Dojo, our MUGA was condemned following a Health and Safety inspection. Thank you to those of you who have contacted me offering help and support. Our dream is to replace the current MUGA with a larger more useable space and even look to rent this out to clubs and other groups in the community.

To do this we are currently looking at a cost of around £60,000 which as you can imagine is unmanageable in the currently climate but through a combination of fund raising, applying for community grants, publicity and the wonderful help of our parent community we are hoping we can make this a reality.

Homework

Homework is the sort of subject that polarises the world of education and families. Earlier this year we took the decision to drastically reduce our expectations around homework. The rationale for this was based on many factors including researchbased evidence. Whilst research is predominantly based on Secondary schools, the pieces about primary do indicate that homework at primary school has very little impact on academic attainment or readiness for the next stage in the child's education however, high parental engagement, good social skills and a love of learning are factors that will ensure children thrive at any stage of their education. For homework to be effective it must be bespoke to the child, working on individual targets.

Some parents have said that homework causes a significant source of stress. Barriers to homework can be for many reasons such as families own experiences of school, language barriers, access to resources or time to allocate to longer creative pieces. It can also be a source of stress and shame for the children – where parents cannot support it can be difficult for the children to complete homework, or where parents are keen for a "beautiful" piece to be handed in and the children are unable to talk about their involvement! Conversely, other families enjoy doing homework and find it an engaging way to be involved with what and how their child is learning.

I have complied an opportunity for parent voice around homework. Please do take some time to complete this so that we can review our homework provision and come to a model that is equitable and inclusive.


World Book Day – Advanced notice
