Our Topic

Our topic this term is 'Here we are'. The children will learn about Steventon and where they live. They will gain an understanding of where they are in the UK and learn about their immediate chronology.

They will learn about their senses and write labels, captions and sentences. They will be listening to poetry and creating some of their own.

In maths they will be deepening their knowledge of and solving problems with numbers to 10.


In science they will be learning about their senses and bodies and how they change over time.

In R, they will be learning about the Christian creation story and how this influences how Christians behave towards nature and the environment.

Reading

Children will read to an adult at least once each week. This will either be individually or in a small group. We will record this in their reading records and will then send the book home for them to share with you. Please use their reading record to comment on how they get on. For the first couple of weeks we will be assessing the children's reading level so please bear with us as we want to ensure they are reading the correct book for their ability. The children will also be encouraged to choose a book from our book corner (which may well be above their reading level) for you to read to them. We will also read to the children at least once a day. During this time we will be learning about different reading strategies and answering comprehension questions.

This could be litter picking or helping a neighbour with some shopping. Take a picture of the work and write about how it made you feel.
