Reading

In Willow Class, reading takes place many times every day. Our classroom is set up in a very child friendly way that encourages them to read and make connections to text within the environment. We also have a class library that children can independently access anytime during the day. Furthermore, we will be teaching daily, whole-class phonics lessons, and **reading** to your child every day. Throughout the next few terms, we will be checking to see if your child is 'ready' to access our reading-scheme books, and when that time comes we will send you more information about reading these books with them at home.

P.E. & Forest School

P.E. is an integral part of the Early Years curriculum and encompasses both gross and fine motor control skills, along with health and self-care. This means that we teach P.E. based skills every day. No additional equipment or clothing is required for this aside from their waterproofs and wellies, as we do most of our physical activities outside, in all weathers. We would like to begin offering Forest School to Willow Class, which will give them more wide-ranging opportunities to explore movement, as well as enhance their sensory exploration of the natural world.
