## **Policy for Access to Education for Pupils with Medical Needs**

The school has a responsibility to ensure that pupils with medical needs have access to high quality educational support to enable them to continue their education effectively. Good communication and co-operation between the school, home and other professionals are essential. A named person is responsible for the effective implementation of this policy.

The key aims of the policy are to:
<ul> <li>□ provide continued education as normally as the condition allows</li> <li>□ reduce the risk of lowering self-confidence and educational achievement</li> <li>□ promote equal access to education for all children and young people</li> <li>□ establish effective liaison</li> <li>□ ensure that prompt action takes place</li> </ul>
The School Administrator will ensure by monitoring:
□ the attendance of all pupils with medical conditions (code <b>I or M</b> authorised absence for medical reasons and code <b>B</b> when the pupil is receiving education other than at school) is recorded accurately □ liaise with an education officer and ESW regarding <b>all</b> pupils expected to be absent from school for 15 days or more (includes time in hospital)
The school SENCO and School Administrator will:
<ul> <li>liaise with the A&amp;E Team, EP, EO, medical professionals and Oxfordshire Hospital School staff, as appropriate to plan provision</li> <li>co-ordinate education provision from the first day of absence for those pupils who have disrupted patterns of schooling (for those pupils with recurring illnesses and chronic conditions)</li> <li>ensure that pupils receive a minimum entitlement of five hours teaching per week, as long as the pupil feels able to cope</li> <li>co-ordinate the provision of work that will support a broad and balanced curriculum, where appropriate by liaising with the designated OHS Outreach Teacher</li> <li>ensure that there are mechanisms in place to communicate information about activities and social events to enable the pupil to keep in touch with peers</li> <li>monitor provision, progress and reintegration arrangements</li> <li>ensure that the views of pupils and parents/carers are taken into account</li> <li>ensure the appropriate Code of Practice (SEN and Disability) procedures are in place, as required.</li> </ul>
This policy endorses the Oxfordshire County Council Policy and DFES Statutory guidance 'Ensuring a good education for children who cannot attend school because of health needs (2013).
