### Dear Families,

Welcome back! This is the delayed newsletter from last week as it didn't feel appropriate to send it following the death of Queen Elizabeth II. School will be closed all day on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September for the Funeral Bank Holiday. We will reopen on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> September at 8:45am.

It has been so wonderful to have the children back in school this week. The new Willow Class children have started school as though they have always been here! They are settled, curious, creative and so incredibly imaginative. There has been a great buzz in classrooms and the children have really hit the ground running with their learning. ## **School Development**

Time stands still for no (wo)man and the process of setting our school development priorities for 2022/2023 is well underway. One key focus will be the promotion of reading for pleasure. As a school we have a wonderfully challenging and diverse text rich curriculum which we are very proud of. However, we would love to ensure this curriculum is really instilling a love of reading in our whole school community. As a staff we will be using our staff meeting time to work with the Open University undertaking their Reading For Pleasure professional development as well as other workshops with the Abingdon Partnership of schools.

You may have seen that we will be launching our Grown Ups Community Book Swap located in the front entrance of school, outside of the office. Please do come along to take a book, swap a book or just donate a book.

#### **School Lunches**

For children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 (Willow, Maple and Sycamore) school dinners are available free of charge under the Universal Free School Meal scheme. Children in Years 3-6 (Rowan, Elm, Ash and Oak) are required to pay for their school lunches (£2.40 a day) This can be done in a number of ways:

- Topping up the School Money 'pot'. This is then automatically charged each time a school lunch is taken.
- BACS payment directly into the school bank account
- Cash paid into the school office

Cash payments into the school office are preferably just for the week that the lunches are taken. All school lunches can be chosen on the day – there is no requirement to prebook them.

## Communication

As mentioned at the end of last term, we will be using Class Dojo as our primary communication method with parents. This will be used by class teachers to share aspects of classroom learning, reminders, homework and updates. There is a private message facility to allow parents to communicate directly with the class teacher. This replaces the individual teacher Gmail email address but will not be constantly monitored. Therefore, if you require an urgent response from the class teacher e.g. there is a change to who is collecting your child, please still email or call the school office.

#### **Meet and Greet**

Meet and Greets for children in Years 1-6 will be on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> September and will run from 3:15 – 3:45pm. It will be an informal "drop in" opportunity for you to come into the classrooms, meet the teachers and look around school. There will be no presentation as in previous years but there will be an opportunity to ask individual questions about the year ahead. We hope this makes it easier for parents with children in multiple year groups.

In a bid to save trees (and money!) we will be uploading the information to Class Dojo in advance.

## **Times of Day**

With the DfE issuing a statutory number of hours per school week, we have brought the start of school forward by 5minutes. School will start at 8:45am and finish at 3:15pm. Please note that children in Ash and Oak who walk to school by themselves must not arrive before 8:35am.

If your child is in Year 5 or Year 6 and would like to walk home by themselves at 3:15pm please let school know in writing by emailing the school office.
