Cultivating Respect, Persevering, and Learning with Courage

Dear Families,

Welcome back. It has been so lovely to have everyone back and to welcome some new families in Years 3 and 5. I know that the children will be living our vision and making them feel welcome.

At St Michael's we have high expectations of everyone and we aim for everyone to achieve their potential not just academically but personally and socially too. We have shared with the children that the process of learning isn't a straight line, that it is messy, uncomfortable, exhilarating and everything in between! During the pandemic, it was much harder to "sweat the small stuff" and so things like punctuation, handwriting, spelling and number formation were much harder to embed. These may feel like unimportant things but these basic skills have such an impact as children progress through school especially in terms of pride in the work they produce.

Our marking policy means that work is "live marked" with the children. Adults use pink highlighter to demonstrate where children have achieved the learning objective and green highlighter to demonstrate new learning or next steps. We are now working on the mindset shift of the more green, the better as this is where the learning happens.

We look forward to welcoming you into school again soon to see this learning in action. Keep your eyes on Class Dojo for more details soon.

Collective Worship

In our Monday collective worship we always share a picture book. We use stories as a way to teach our vision and values just as Jesus did. In fact, story is the basis of so many religions and is an incredibly powerful way to explore complex themes and messages. This term we will be sharing stories on the theme of kindness and community which reinforces our vision to "do to others as you would have them do to you".

Our Thursday collective worship which is taken by Rev. Phil and the Children's Ministry Team will be along the theme of Perseverance. They will be learning about different bible stories that demonstrate this but also modern day links too.

Friday worship is a celebration assembly. We share postcards and celebrate our vision and values in action but in the classroom and at other times. It would be really great if we could share some achievements from outside of school too. Please do let your child's teacher know if there is something for us to share.
