Dear Families,

Dydd Dewi Sant Hapus and Welcome back to Term 4! The children have really impressed me over the last two weeks with their attitude to learning and their behaviours. We have had several prospective parents looking round and Governors visiting who have also commented on how calm and purposeful the classrooms were as well as how hard working, engaged and polite the children were.

Year 6 have particularly impressed me with their approach this week. Following the introduction of a change to lunchtime that they did not agree with, a group came to my office yesterday breaktime to discuss their complaints and were challenged to come back later in the day with a proposal. By lunchtime they had drawn up a variation to the original idea, discussed how it was going to be implemented and could offer solutions to the challenges I gave them. Their plan has now been realised and will be rolled out from Monday!

Parents Evening and Interim Reports

Parents Evenings will be held online w/c 18th March. You will be sent invitations to these in the coming weeks. Interim reports will also be sent out. Feedback was generally positive, and parents said they felt they helped shaped a more meaningful conversation during the meetings.

Where parents didn't find them as useful this was around the lack of a personal comment or clarity around what the end of year expectations are. The aim of the interim report is to give parents an indication of where their child is at the moment, whether that is working towards, working, or exceeding the end of year expectations. These expectations were shared in September, but we will resend them with the interim reports. The 1:1 meeting takes the place of the personal comments.

Homework

Huge thanks to those of you who completed the feedback questionnaire on homework. We are currently discussing with staff what homework will look like in practice and aim to have some kind of tiered approach ready to launch after Easter.

We are requesting a minimum £10 donation on the door. Follow the link to sign up!




